Return to Live Learning

- We will continue to follow the processes that have been identified in our school reentry plan.
- AT Home versus Live we are asking families to identify learning formats. This will help us know where students are for safety purposes.

- Create consistency for teachers in the classroom

The four year plan will be planning on a post pandemic world, but will obviously need to be adjusted as necessary.

Four year planning process
