# Welcome Back Everyone and Happy New Year!

If a student cannot attend a school exam due to sickness please connect with the teacher to set up an alternate date if possible.

The last day of classes for **all students** is Tuesday, January 17. Exams run from Wednesday, January 18 to Friday, January 27 for Grades 10-12. Grade 9 have the option to take part in the Career Explorations Week from January 23 - 27 (see below).
