Hike Day

SAIT Dual Credit Introduction to Baking Course

This course returns to BCHS in Semester 1, starting on **September 11th.** It is open to all students in Grades 11 and 12 regardless of whether or not they are taking Foods this semester. The course is taught by an instructor from SAIT and successful completion earns students five credits at the 30 level (Grade 12) and 3 credits at SAIT. Teacher Support

Assignment completion is a work habit and skill that we hope all students develop as they pass through high school. Renew your Pauw Pass

Fall and winter drop-in sports, fitness, skating, and motoring munchkin sessions kick-off in October. Banff residents need to renew their annual Pauw Pass (formerly Banff Activity Pass) to access the great sports, fitness, swimming, Mountain Adventure programs, and social sessions offered. Passes can be renewed in-person at The Fenlands 8:30 a.m. – 8:30 p.m. daily. **Annual passes are free for Banff residents aged 0 – 25 and \$10 for residents age 26+.** For a quicker renewal, bring your current membership card.
