ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (ENGLISH)

The requirements indicated in this chart are the minimum requirements for a student to attain an Alberta High School Diploma. The requirements for entry into post-secondary institutions and workplaces may require additional and specific courses.

100 CREDITS
including the following:

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS 30-1 or 30-2 **LANGUAGE ARTS** - **30** **LEVEL**

SOCIAL STUDIES 30-1 or 30-2 **STUDIES** - **30** **LEVEL**

MATHEMATICS 20-1, Mathematics 20-2 or Mathematics 20-3 - **20** **LEVEL**

SCIENCE 20, Science 24, Biology 20, Chemistry 20 or Physics 20 - **20** **LEVEL**

PHYSICAL EDUCATION 10 (3 CREDITS)

CAREER AND LIFE MANAGEMENT (3 CREDITS)

10 CREDITS IN ANY COMBINATION FROM:

- Career and Technology Studies (CTS)
- Fine Arts
- Second Languages
- Physical Education 20 and/or 30
- Locally developed/acquired and locally authorized courses in CTS, fine arts, second languages, Knowledge and Employability courses
- two 35-level courses from any trade in the Registered Apprenticeship Program

10 CREDITS IN ANY 30-LEVEL COURSE (IN ADDITION TO A 30-LEVEL ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AND A 30-LEVEL SOCIAL STUDIES COURSE AS SPECIFIED ABOVE)

These courses may include:

- 30-level locally developed/acquired and locally authorized courses
- Advanced Level (3000 Series) in Career and Technology Studies Courses

Graduation Deadlines

The Grad Cap & Gown Ceremony will take place on Thursday June 26th, **2025** at 12 noon at **the Banff Springs Hotel**.

- Completion of the necessary courses and credits to fulfil the diploma requirements by the end of second semester.
- Register with myPass (myPass.alberta.ca).
- Submit a printed/parent signed copy of your Credential Page and Detailed Academic Report to the main office by **Sept 30/2024**.
(**This is your Grad Plan**)
- Students must have a minimum mark of 50% in any compulsory course to meet graduation requirements by **May 31st, 2025**
- The date of **May 31st, 2025** is also the cutoff date used to determine honours eligibility for our commencement ceremony. Note that final achievement of honours standing can only be determined upon the completion of diploma exams. Students that have achieved honours at this point will wear an honours cord to recognize this achievement. Note - Honours Society marks are calculated in the fall once all final grades have been determined.
- Students must have paid school fees

Fundraising

Costs Associated with Graduation

Please remember that **graduation is 100% user pay**. Fundraising helps to offset some of the costs associated with the ceremony and reception.

Ceremony

At Banff Community High School, all graduation fees are covered through student fundraising.

This fundraising covers the cost of the following:

- Gown/Stole Memento caps and tassel purchase
- Student Reception for Grads- note all guests must pay to attend the reception

The graduation committee generally organises the fundraising events to help with funding.

Grad Photos

Graduation portraits will be taken in March 2025. Appointment bookings will be made on-line beginning in February. Any students who know they will not be here during photo time or require retakes must contact the Lifetouch in Calgary at 403-255-5440 or email qwterritory@lifetouch.com to set up an appointment.

It is important that every Grad have a photo taken for the composite picture and yearbook. There is no obligation to purchase these photos.

Picture packages are made available to individual graduates, with the cost varying according to the package contents. Cost information is made available by Lifetouch (www.lifetouch.ca) when proofs arrive.

Valedictorian and Governor General Awards

BCHS Staff will nominate students for the BCHS Valedictorian based on the following criteria if they have achieved Honour Roll by May 31st 2025:

Representation - the candidate will be a student who represents graduates of Banff Community High School, having attended BCHS for at least TWO years with a minimum course load of 50%.

Academic Achievement - the candidate should be an honour roll student as defined by [Rutherford](#) criteria.

Banff BEAR - the candidate can demonstrate that they live the BCHS BEAR code by providing examples of how they give back to our school through their participation in student-led school activities and volunteer work to make our school a welcoming place where members of our BCHS school community feel they belong, and are respected.

Writing Ability - the candidate must compose a formal address worthy of the occasion.

Speaking Ability - the candidate must be able to deliver the address effectively to a large audience at the graduation exercises.

The **Governor General Award** is awarded to the student who achieves the highest average upon graduation from all their Grade 11 and 12 courses. This is usually announced for our Honour Roll Society Evening at Thanksgiving after graduation i.e. October 2025.

2024/2025- Post-Secondary Events And Information

October and November are recruitment months. Most Universities, colleges and technical programs do “open houses” and “student for a day” tours for students in the hopes of attracting you to their institution. These are great opportunities to engage in conversations and pick up information on a particular school. Additionally, we run two fairs per year in the Fall.
