Music program fundraiser

Every three years our School Council has the opportunity to hold a Casino Fundraiser to support various initiatives in the school that enhance students' activities and opportunities. The funds raised in 2022 were spent over the last two years to purchase a new sound system in the school gym, furniture for the new student lounge, and equipment for Fashion Design, Music, PE, and Art.

Running a casino requires volunteer parents to manage, organise, and attend the casino. A sub committee led by Dr Brian Sand, our music teacher, and a school council member came forward in November to propose that the January casino fundraises for the Music program. Specifically the music program is looking to add a recording studio and take the band on field trips. It was agreed at the December School Council meeting that the bulk of the fundraising amount (potentially \$40 000-50 000) will go towards the Music program and some will also be put aside for other initiatives in the school. We are looking for volunteers from our whole school community helping our music parents and school council executive make this fundraising effort a success.
