## **Semester Two Starts on Tuesday**

Semester two and Quarter three (for Grade 9 option courses) starts on **Tuesday, January 28th**. Students should look at their schedule in PowerSchool. Grade 9 students have a switch in their schedule: 9A have Humanities in Block A and STEM in Block D while 9B now have STEM in Block A and Humanities in Block D. <u>Grade 12 students only</u> have until **Friday February 7th** to withdraw from a course or to request a course change. This change should reflect their graduation plan. Course change requests are not being taken from Grade 9 to 11 students at this stage.

# Main Entrance and Door Opening Times

The new entrance is finished and students and staff will use this as the main entrance to the school. Banff Avenue (side door) and Beaver Street entrances will be open at 8am until the start of classes and again over lunchtime. Any late students or visitors should use the main entrance and ring the doorbell then patiently wait for the door to be opened. The Banff Avenue side entrance will no longer be open during the school day.

Also, students are not supervised at the end of the day after 4pm. The doors will be locked from Purkis Hall into the main building at this time. Students may stay in Purkis Hall if there is a team practice taking place but parents should know that there is no supervision.

### Grade 12 Diploma Results

Diploma exam results will be available in <u>myPass</u> on **February 18th**. If a student feels that their diploma exam was not scored appropriately, the can request a rescore in myPass. The deadline is February 27th. There is an administration fee payable to Alberta Education for each diploma exam rescore requested. This fee is paid by the student.

## **Textbook Return**

Students who have completed semester one courses **must** return their textbooks and novels to the library this week. Textbooks cost between \$80 and \$100 each. If a student does not return a textbook before semester two starts they will not receive a semester two textbook unless they pay for a replacement or find and return the book.

### **New Student Passwords**

Students will be issued with new login passwords in their Humanities classes on **Wednesday**, **January 29th**. On Saturday, February 1st the switchover will be made and students will not be able to log onto their CRPS Google account until Sunday. Students must not share their passwords with others.

# **Report Cards**

Report cards for Semester 1 will be issued in Power School on **Friday**, **January 31st.** Please do look at these as they are important documents describing your child's progress to date. Teachers often provide suggestions for the semester ahead.

Grade 9 students have had their learning assessed using **Outcomes Based Assessment** (more information can be found here). Their report cards will look different to grades 10 - 12 report cards and also to those they received at Banff Elementary School in Grade 8. Please take the time to look beyond the percentage mark and read what outcomes your child has strengths in and what outcomes your child can continue to make progress in. Teachers have placed considerable emphasis on this section of the report card. By going through this section with your child you can support them in understanding what skills and understandings they can develop further in the second half of the year.

This report was shared at the School Council meeting in November and will be shared with the Board of Trustees in February. We want to share with you, a couple of facts each week. Surveys are conducted in the spring and include all students, Grade 10 parents, and all teachers. We always strive to make the results even better every year and in the spring we will be seeking input from our stakeholders as we go through the process of developing a new four-year School Education Plan for 2025-2029 to help prioritize actions we need to take to address change and progress.

- <u>Fact #1:</u> 75% of our students in 23/24 feel safe at BCHS in comparison to the Canadian norm of 58%. We strive for 100%!
- <u>Fact #2:</u> 81.3% of the survey respondents in 23/24, report that students are engaged in their learning. Guess what? We strive for 100%!
