# Grade 12 Diploma Results

Diploma exam results will be available in <u>myPass</u> on **February 18th**. If a student feels that their diploma exam was not scored appropriately, the can request a rescore in myPass. The deadline is February 27th. There is an administration fee payable to Alberta Education for each diploma exam rescore requested. This fee is paid by the student.

# **New Student Passwords**

In order to protect students' online access to their CRPS Google accounts and to help teach them the good practice of changing passwords periodically, students have been issued with new passwords. On Saturday, February 1st the switchover will be made and students will not be able to log onto their CRPS Google account until Sunday. Students must not share their passwords with others.

# **Report Cards**

Report cards for Semester 1 will be issued in Power School on **Friday**, **January 31st** at the end of the day. Please do look at these as they are important documents describing your child's progress to date. Teachers often provide suggestions for the semester ahead.

Grade 9 students have had their learning assessed using **Outcomes Based Assessment** (more information can be found here). Their report cards will look different to grades 10 - 12

report cards and also to those they received at Banff Elementary School in Grade 8. Please take the time to look beyond the percentage mark and read what outcomes your child has strengths in and what outcomes your child can continue to make progress in. Teachers have placed considerable emphasis on this section of the report card. By going through this section with your child you can support them in understanding what skills and understandings they can develop further in the second half of the year.

## **Shared Vision of Learning**

# Fun Facts from our School Annual Results Report!

This report was shared at the School Council meeting in November and will be shared with the Board of Trustees in February. Provincial and divisional surveys of all students, Grade 10 parents, and all teachers are conducted in the spring We always strive to make the results even better every year and in the spring we will be seeking input from our stakeholders as we go through the process of developing a new four-year School Education Plan for 2025-2029 to help prioritize actions to address change and progress. In order for more of our community to know about some of the details, we will share a couple each week in this newsletter so that we can get ready for the planning process coming up. On **Wednesday, February 5th** our student leadership council will meet with two members of the CRPS Senior Admin team and undergo a process called **'Student Voices'** to gain feedback from them on life at BCHS and as a starting point for developing the new education plan.

- Fact #1: 6.5/10 students recognise that there are positive teacher-student relations. This is higher than the Canadian norm.
- Fact #2: Grade 9 students achieved a level of excellence in Math, Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies significantly above the provincial average in their 2024 Provincial Assessment Tests.

# Wellness Weekly Tip

Exciting things are happening at BCHS! If you're looking to improve your mental health, the Wellness Committee is here to help! Two new initiatives rolled out in January:

The Wellness Committee came up with an idea to support students getting help quietly if they need it.
