Personal Mobile Device Policy



Grade 12 Diploma Results

Diploma exam results are available in **myPass** on February 18th. If a student wishes to request a rescore of their exam this needs to be done by February 27th by the students in **myPass**. There is an administration fee paid to Alberta Education for each diploma exam rescore paid by the student through myPass.

Each day we consider how we will strive to empower learners to be critical, creative thinkers, innovators, problem solvers, effective communicators, and collaborators, who are globally aware, independent, and responsible citizens. This is the second of six belief statements and exemplification of how we are living our beliefs at BCHS.

At BCHS in Semester 1 we embraced this by:

- Grade 9 and 10 teachers from BCHS and CCHS have collaborated on the implementation (Gr 9) and preparation for 25/26 (Gr 10) of Outcomes Based Assessment for determining student learning and progress.
- All teachers have been undertaking and applying Professional Learning to their assessment practice in order to make it accurate, bias-resistant and motivational.
- We had another fabulous Honour Roll Presentation Evening at Banff Springs Hotel in October at which 83 students were recognised for their excellence in academic achievement.
- Our school leaders, the principal, the acting principal and acting assistant principal, lead teachers in professional learning both in assessment and differentiation practice supporting all learners.
- Our diploma course teachers welcomed and celebrated the Governor General Bronze Medal 23/24 recipient, Patrick Purcell, who gained the highest average for Grade 11 and 12 courses in his time at BCHS.

Next week we will learn what has happened at BCHS in regard to the fourth ' believe' statement during semester 1. Do visit our **Shared Vision of Learning** display board in Purkis Hall to explore this vision in action further.

Did you know? Fun Facts from our School Annual Results Report!

This report was shared at the School Council meeting in November and will be shared with the Board of Trustees at their annual retreat this weekend. Provincial and divisional surveys are conducted in the spring of all students, Grade 10 parents, and all teachers. We always strive to make the results even better every year and in the spring we will be seeking input from our stakeholders as we go through the process of developing a new four-year School Education Plan for 2025-2029 to prioritize actions to address change and progress. In order for more of our community to know about some of the details, we will share a couple each week in this newsletter so that we can get ready for the planning process coming up.

Fact #1: In Math 30-1 22.2% of students achieved a level of excellence in their diploma exam and in Math 30-2 this was at 33.3%.



Fact #2: Although 31% of our students reported that they experience anxiety this is down from last year and slightly below the Canadian norm.
