June 2025 Exam Timetable

Grade 12 students start their exam period in earnest this week; English 30-1 /30-2 Part A is on Wednesday and Social Studies 30-1/30-2 is on Thursday.

Meanwhile Grade 9 continues with PATs: English 9 Part B on Thursday and Math 9 Part A on Friday.

Unless students have an exam they do not need to come to school during exam week.

All exams start at 8.30am. Students need to come prepared with their writing implements, snacks, and water. Cell phones, ear buds, and Smart Watches are not allowed in the exam room. Students must arrive within the first hour of the exam starting or they cannot write.

Please let the school office know if your child is ill prior to the exam.

- Diploma exam dates are fixed by the province and these exams cannot be taken on another day. Students will need to rebook the exam at an alternative exam centre in August through My Pass.

Summer Work Experience

Is your child interested in earning Work Experience credits for employment during the summer and/or part-time throughout the year?

Students can earn one credit for every 25 hours worked, up to a maximum of 15 credits, which can be applied toward the 100 credits required for graduation. These can be 30 level credits!

If students already have a job secured, register for work experience by **June 27th**. The following steps outline the registration process:

1. Student Registration: The student and a parent or guardian must complete the [Parent/Guardian & Student Work Experience Registration Form](#).
2. Employer Registration: Students should discuss this opportunity with their employer to ensure their support because the employer will be sent an Employer Registration Form (sent directly to them via email) that is similar to the student's registration form. This ensures everyone is aware of what is happening and is on board.
3. Monthly Submissions: Students will be sent an invitation to join a Google Classroom where they will submit their proof of hours worked and a brief reflection on their experience at the end of each month.

If students are applying for a job but do not have it secured yet. We would love for you to still get credits. Still apply using the directions above as soon as possible and we will try our best to get you registered.

Work experience can conclude at the end of the summer or continue into the school year, depending on the student's ongoing employment and interest in earning additional credits.

Important Information for Grade 12s

- GRADS - YOU MUST MOVE YOUR DATA AT THE END OF THE YEAR or YOU WILL LOSE IT!
- You should have a myPass account set up. This is where you will request transcripts for post-secondary applications. While you're there, check that your mailing address is correct - this is where Alberta Education will mail your diploma.
- If you are applying for post-secondary scholarships, use a personal email account, not your CRPS email.
- You will need to move your data **before** you leave BCHS. Accounts will be turned off in July.
- Google has tools to help you including:

- **Download** - if there are only a few things you want to keep, including items shared with you, [download](#) a copy of individual files or folders.
- **Forward important emails** to a personal email account. [Learn more.](#)
- **Transfer your content** - copy your drive and email files to a personal Google account. [Learn more.](#)
- **Archive/Takeout** - download a copy of items owned by you in all G Suite services into one zip file. [Learn more.](#)
- **Transfer Ownership** - If others will need to use files you own, you can transfer ownership to someone else at CRPS using sharing options, or they can make a copy for themselves. [Learn more.](#)
