# 'SWAG' Hike Day Planning

Next week we will start organising our annual Hike Day in our SWAG (School Wellness Advisory Groups). This is a tradition at BCHS that allows students to explore Banff National Park over the four years that they are with us. It helps build community as the hikes are made up of students from all grades and obviously we hope that being out in the great outdoors boosts everyone's wellness. Hike Day is on **Tuesday, September 9th** but if the weather is looking poor we have September, 10th in reserve. This year's hikes are: Larch Valley, Stanley Glacier, Plain of Six Glaciers, Healy Pass, Lake Annette, Boom Lake, and Little Beehive. Students will choose their hikes on Wednesday so parents should look out for a consent letter to sign and return by **Friday, September 5th**. On **Monday, September 8th at 6.45pm** there will be a virtual meeting

for any parents whose child has chosen Stanley Glacier. This hike is considered to be out of province and therefore we are required to hold an information session. A link to the virtual meeting will be sent out towards the end of next week.

#### **Dress Code**

Our Code of Conduct for students requires students to 'dress appropriately for classes and activities'. In our student and families handbook we also describe that 'students should consider how they present to others when they choose what to wear to school. This school is a workplace environment that focuses on respect for all, building self-esteem, and supporting diversity and individuality.' As we continue to have hot weather at the end of August and into the start of September we will be reminding students of what 'appropriately dressed' for school means.

#### **Outcomes-Based Assessment Grades 9 and 10**

In 24/25 CRPS high school teachers adopted a more accurate, bias-resistant, and motivational method for assessing and reporting Grade 9 student learnin. This assessment process moves away from traditional methods that focus on single, overall grades. In 25/26 this approach is will continue for grade 9s and start being implemented in Grade 10 level courses. This change aligns with evidence-based research, the Shared Vision of Learning, and CRPS' existing practices in Kindergarten to Gr. 8. Despite this shift, overall percentage grades reflecting student achievement will still be reported.

Outcomes-based assessment centers on evaluating students based on how well they meet specific learning outcomes outlined in <u>Alberta Education's Programs of Study</u>. This study details what students should know and be able to do. Unlike traditional grading, this method focuses on demonstrated knowledge and skills rather than factors like behavior, attendance, or participation, which are reported separately. This approach allows teachers to provide clear feedback, helping students understand the criteria for success, and areas where they need to improve. Students become more engaged and motivated when they know which outcomes they have mastered and which require more effort.

Teachers assess student achievement by comparing their work to the learning outcomes. Evidence of learning includes classroom products (essays, projects, tests), performance tasks (presentations, labs, drills), and observations. Some of this evidence is used to give students feedback and does not count toward final grades (Formative Assessment), while other assessments contribute to the final grade (Summative Assessment).
